<b>ACCUPLACER</b> College/Post-Secondary entrance exam	11	April 3 <sup>rd</sup>	To measure student ability in preparation for education at a two-year or technical school. The results will show whether students are prepared for college-level courses in each specific test subject area. 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<b>AP Tests</b> Advanced Placement tests	10-12	May 7-18	Students take the AP exam after they have completed the AP course in order to determine whether they have mastered enough of the content to obtain college credit in that subject area.	2-.5 hours	Students get their scores back in July
<b>PSAT</b> Suite of Assessments	11	October 10	The PSAT is an admission test accepted by all U.S. colleges, and the College Board has programs to encourage all students to take advantage of higher education. It will also make it easier for students to navigate a path from high school through college and career.	5 hours	October 19-21
<b>ASVAB</b> College/Post-Secondary entrance exam	11	April 3 <sup>rd</sup>	To determine eligibility for enlistment in the Army, Navy, Air Force, and Marine Corps; the score is used to determine the best job for you in the military.
